



HOW DO YOU WANT TO STUDY?

Education is no longer one size fits all. We realise everyone has different needs and priorities. Here we provide information on your options to help you make the best decision for you.

Study as

Domestic

You're a domestic student if you're a citizen or permanent resident of New Zealand (this includes Tokelau, the Cook Islands and Niue). Or if you're a citizen or permanent resident of Australia who is currently residing in New Zealand.

International

You're an international student if you are NOT a citizen or permanent resident of New Zealand or an Australian citizen permanently residing in New Zealand. You're still considered international if you hold or qualify for a tertiary domestic visa.

Study level

Introduction, foundation, and pathway programmes

If you're just starting on your tertiary study journey, you may like to complete an introductory programme before progressing to further study. This can be useful for school leavers and people changing careers, to help you get ready to succeed in a career or further study.

Certificates and Diplomas

We have a number of Certificates and Diplomas available. These range from foundational knowledge and practical skills for the workplace to more advanced theoretical and technical training.

We also offer Graduate Certificates and Graduate Diplomas which allow you to build on your previous study and move on to postgraduate study if you wish.

Bachelor's Degree

These degrees usually last three years when studied full-time. They provide a comprehensive understanding of a particular area and allow you to move into work or postgraduate study.

Face-to-face



You will need to have a minimum of 50 NCEA credits at Level 2 or above, including 12 credits in English or a related subject at level 2 or above, and a minimum of 10 Numeracy credits at Level 1 or above or be able to demonstrate equivalent knowledge or skills. These include a maximum total of 16 in the best four Sixth Form Certificate subjects including English or a related subject, or completion of a trades qualification at Level 3 or above using English as the language of instruction, or completion of the New Zealand Certificate in Building Regulatory Environment (Level 4).



You will need 10 Literacy credits at Level 2 or above including five credits in reading and five in writing. You will need 10 Numeracy credits at Level 1 or above.

Special Admission

You will need to be at least 20 years old by the first day of study and have sufficient evidence of aptitude, or work or life experience that would indicate a successful outcome in your qualification. This experience should be in the trades area, building construction, plumbing, civil architectural drafting, or engineering fields. Your evidence can comprise written evidence, an interview, referee checks or a combination of these.

Future Skills student Mingmin Guo has been awarded a Bunckenburg Bursary to assist her with her bachelor's studies.

The HH Bunckenburg Memorial Trust was established in honour of Henry Herbert Bunckenburg, who was a great influence on the quantity surveying profession.

Three Bunckenburg Bursaries are awarded to New Zealand Institute of Quantity Surveyors (NZIQS) members who have completed a diploma and are now studying towards a degree.

Mingmin decided to make a complete career change after having her second child. She had previously worked as an Early Childhood Teacher but decided it was time for something different.

"I wasn't sure if at my age I could still do it, study, have kids, and look after the family, but I wanted to give it a try," she says.

Future Skills's class schedule and central location fitted in with her family commitments, so she enrolled in the NZ Diploma in Construction (Quantity Surveying).

After completing her diploma she enrolled in the Bachelor of Construction.

The Bunckenburg Bursary will help Mingmin fund her bachelor's study. She says her teachers wrote reference letters to support her bursary application, which also included an academic transcript.

Mingmin says she's thoroughly enjoying studying with Future Skills. Highlights have included getting to meet other students who have the same dream of becoming a Quantity Surveyor.

She studies alongside both domestic and international students at our CBD campus and has become friends with a group of students whose circumstances are similar to her own. They are all very busy taking care of their families on top of their study.

Mingmin is also grateful to her lecturers here who she says are very understanding of different students' situations. They support her with her assignments and have granted extensions when her children were sick in the winter.





You will need to provide a Work Experience Agreement from your employer or Centre Manager. You will need to be physically able to perform the work duties of an early childhood educator or professional nanny.

You will need to have NCEA Level 2 if you are under 20 or four years' secondary education or equivalent and evidence of your potential to study at tertiary level. You will also need a police vet report with no convictions of concern as well as previous experience with children and involvement in a range of cultural, social, sporting or community services.

You will be interviewed to assess your suitability for the role and motivation to study the programme. You will need to provide the contact details for three referees and permission to contact them.

If English is not your first language, you must provide:

- New Zealand University Entrance OR
- New Zealand Certificate in English Language (Level 4) (General) or (Employment), OR
- Overall IELTS Academic score of 5.5 with no band score lower than 5 (achieved in one test completed in the last two years), OR
- Acceptable alternative evidence of the required IELTS (<u>see here</u> for NZQA proficiency table and a list of recognised proficiency tests).

You will be interviewed to assess your suitability for the role and motivation to study the programme. You will need to provide the contact details for three referees and permission to contact them.

A history of successful study will help your application.





Aiulu Pau is transforming her career at Future Skills Academy. "I have learned so much here," the mother of four says. "It's changed my life."

Aiulu,43, graduates soon with the NZ Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Caregiving) (Level 2). She has her sights set on a caregiving career after finishing a rewarding practicum and completing all her paperwork. "That's my dream job."


For her project, Huyen chose to work on a dataset provided by the Ministry of Education to look into the international enrolments in New Zealand tertiary education.



Step 1: How to apply

You can get the application form in either of these ways:

- Fill out an online application form here.
- If you're unable to apply online, please call us on 0800 888 001 or write to us at <u>info@futureskills.co.nz</u> and our student admissions team will be happy to assist you.

Step 2: Appointment to process your application

Your appointment to process your application is very important – and a great way for us to get to know you!

After you fill out the application form above or send us an enquiry, we will give you a call to talk about your study plans. Then, we will confirm our admissions appointment date, time and location. This appointment can be conducted in person, online or over the phone. We'll also send you text and phone call reminders to make sure you remember your interview, or to notify you of any changes. Please read the Documentation section below to find out what you will need to bring to your admissions appointment.

If your application is successful:

You will be given an Offer Letter, including start and end dates, tuition fees for your programme (if applicable), as well as a Response Form for you to confirm acceptance of the offer. This Offer Letter may be presented in hard copy or sent to you electronically to sign or acknowledge.

If your application is unsuccessful:

You will be informed of the reason. Reasons may include that you have not supplied all the information that we require, or your application does not meet the entry requirements of the programme. We may be able to find you another suitable programme to enrol in.

Step 3: Your response

Once you sign or acknowledge the Offer Letter, you will be enrolled. We can assist you with your application for a student allowance to StudyLink if you wish.

Step 4: Payment of fees (does not apply to fee-free programmes)

If enrolled in a fee-paying programme, your enrolment is conditional upon receipt of the full tuition fees. Payment can be done to the Public Trust by electronic bank transfer, bank deposit, or by credit card.

If you are paying your fees with the help of a student loan, we recommend you arrange this immediately. We can assist you with your application to StudyLink if you wish.

Any scholarship or funding secured towards the qualification needs to be approved up front prior to commencement of the programme.

Step 5: You're ready to study

Congratulations! You're ready to study at Future Skills. In the meantime, if you have any questions about your enrolment, please do not hesitate to contact our Student Services team.

Record of Prior Learning

You may have achieved credits before enrolling with Future Skills. Just let us know what you've studied previously, and we can confirm the credits you've achieved. In some cases, you may have already gained credits towards a qualification.

Documentation

Please bring the following documents with you, when you come for an enrolment interview:

- Birth certificate OR passport
- Proof of address. This is any official document you have received in the mail identifying you and your home address (e.g. bank statement or letter)
- Additional documentation may be required if you're studying our Level 3, Level 4, or Level 6 programmes.

ENROLMENT TERMS & CONDITIONS

Fees

Confirmation of enrolment and a fees invoice will be sent to your email. Payment of all fees are due prior to the programme of study/course start date.

If you are applying for a learner loan through StudyLink, we expect you to complete your application as soon as possible and no later than the programme of study/course start date.

Learners who wish to dispute the fees or request a review of fees or account balance must do so within seven (7) working days of receiving the invoice. Any requests must be made in writing to the registry office.

At the discretion of Future Skills, and with just cause, this period may be extended. Once the request is received, the review will be completed within seven (7) working days. Once the review is completed, any outstanding balance is due immediately.

Failure to pay any invoice(s) by the due date means you will then be liable for all costs and expenses incurred in the recovery, or attempted recovery of the overdue amount from you.

This includes legal costs and debt collection agent fees, which may affect your credit rating.

Under these circumstances Future Skills may give to, or obtain from, any relevant third-party, information held about your personal or commercial credit.

Academic results for any programme of study or course(s) will be withheld where fees or any other debt remains unpaid. You will be prevented from graduating or receiving your award(s) until your debt has been paid in full. You will also be prevented from re-enrolling in further programmes of study or courses at Future Skills.

Transfer to another programme of study or course

Transfers are negotiated with the Head of Department or Programme Leader. There are no penalties; however, there may be additional fees required or a refund may be due. Where a learner loan has been used to pay fees, the refund will need to be returned to StudyLink and a new loan drawn down for the new programme.

Withdrawal and/or refunds

The key points of Future Skills's refund policy, <u>Withdrawal</u>, <u>Transfer</u>, <u>Cancellation and Refund Policy</u> are summarised below.

If you have any questions, contact the registry office. Make sure you understand the refund policy before enrolling.

If you wish to leave your programme of study or course, you must formally withdraw. This means you must notify Future Skills in writing by emailing:

Verbal notice of withdrawal will not be accepted as a learner's intention to withdraw. The withdrawal date from a programme is taken as the date the email is lodged. This will then be used when processing

your withdrawal in the Learner Management System (SMS).

Please take a note of the "early withdrawal period", the period you can withdraw by and be able to receive a refund, less admin fees.

Compassionate consideration

If you withdraw after the last date for a withdrawal with a refund date has passed you may be eligible to apply for compassionate consideration. Compassionate consideration may be considered for the following reasons:

Health and wellbeing, supported in writing by a health professional.

Other unanticipated circumstances beyond your control.

Future Skills will advise the result of the application for compassionate consideration.

Non-attendance

If you have more than four consecutive weeks of non-attendance in classes, or non-participation in required online activities associated with your programme, and we are unable to contact you, you will be withdrawn from the programme.

Public Trust

As part of the enrolment process, you will receive a Public Trust Fee Protection Contract. By law, private training establishments registered with the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) are required to have some form of protection for fees paid to them in advance. Future Skills has chosen Public Trust.

Public Trust - Fee Protect

Fee Protect is a learner fee trust account which ensures you receive a refund on learner fees, which are held in trust, in the unlikely event, Future Skills is unable to complete your programme of study. This could be because of closure, insolvency, loss of NZQA accreditation or programme within the stated timeframe.

You are required to initial, sign, and return the Public Trust Contract to Future Skills within seven days of its receipt. You will find more information about Public Trust – Fee Protect here.

Cancellation of programme or course

Enrolment in a programme of study or course is conditional upon and subject to enough learners enrolling in the programme of study or course.

Privacy or Personal Information

Will I have to pay tuition fees?

New Zealand and Australian citizens and resident visa holders can study some of our programmes without tuition fees.*

From 1 January 2018, tertiary education at Levels 3 and above have been free of fees for eligible first-time tertiary students. You may be able to get one year's study Fees Free. Find out whether you're eligible at www.feesfree.govt.nz

If you don't know your NSN, call us for a chat. If you discover you aren't eligible under the fees-free scheme, you may still be able to study without paying any fees. All our Level 1 and 2 and some Level 3 programmes are available without fees subject to different eligibility or scholarship conditions.

StudyLink can help pay for your study. But it is important to apply early to get everything sorted in time. StudyLink may be able to help you with compulsory course fees such as books, your living costs

and other expenses such as disability or childcare. You can apply to <u>StudyLink here</u> if you need a student loan. If you need help with your application, we're here to help.


